

Candidate Checklist – November 8, 2022 General

Keep for your records

Listed below is a description of the various mandatory and optional forms to be filed for candidates running for seats in the November 8, 2022 Election. It is the obligation of the candidate, incumbents and challengers, to ensure that filing requirements and deadlines have been met. The County Election Officials urges all candidates to file the required documents as early as possible to avoid a last-minute rush, confusion or misunderstanding. Additionally, the Elections Officials recommends that the candidate file all documents personally.

Candidates for city council seats must contact their respective City Clerk for Candidate filing requirements.

Change of Candidate Designation on Ballot	Last day for any nominated candidate to change his or her ballot designation from the June Primary, upon filing a written request with the Register of Voters.	Aug 2 (E-98)	
Candidate Intention Statement – Form 501	File Form 501 before you solicit or receive any contributions or before you make expenditures from personal funds on behalf of your candidacy. This form is considered filed the date it is postmarked or hand delivered.	Prior to soliciting	
Candidate Public Information Worksheet	All Candidates – incumbents and challengers	July 18 – Aug. 12 (E-113 to E-88)	
Short Form 470	Officeholders and candidates who: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> do not have a controlled committee; do not anticipate receiving contributions totaling \$2,000 or more during the calendar year; and do not anticipate spending \$2,000 or more during the calendar year. 	July 18 – Aug. 12 (E-113 to E-88)	
Form 470 Supplement	Officeholder or candidate when: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> for an election year and later receives contributions totaling \$2,000 or more or makes expenditures totaling \$2,000 or more during the same calendar year 	Due within 48 hours	
Nomination Documents for Candidates	All Candidates – incumbents and challengers	July 18 – Aug. 12 (E-113 to E-88)	
Candidate's Statement of Qualifications	Optional for all candidates. Candidates for county offices in runoffs and nominees for State Senate or state Assembly who have accepted the Prop. 34 campaign expenditure limits	For November election nominees by 5pm on Aug. 12	
Ballot Designation Worksheet	Optional for all candidates. Three words or less that appear underneath candidates name on ballot <ul style="list-style-type: none"> vocation, occupation or profession 	July 18 – Aug. 12 (E-113 to E-88)	
Statement of Economic Interest – Form 700	All Candidates – incumbents and challengers	July 18 – Aug. 12 (E-113 to E-88)

The nomination extension does not apply where no incumbent to be elected	Aug. 13 – Aug. 17 (E-87 to E-83)

Semi-Annual	Each candidate listed on the ballot must file Form 460 or Form 470	Aug 1	
First Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure Statement	Filing period for 1 st pre-election campaign statement covers transactions July 1 through Sept 24. Statements must be sent by personal delivery or first class mail.	Sept 29 (E-40)	
Second Pre-Election Campaign Disclosure Statement	Filing period for 2 nd pre-election campaign statement covers transactions Sept 25 through October 22. Statements must be sent by personal delivery or guaranteed overnight delivery.	Oct 27 (E-12)	
Semi-Annual Campaign Disclosure Statement	Statement covers transactions through December 31. Statements must be sent by personal delivery or first class mail.	24 hours
