Subject: 2022 El Dorado County Wine Grape Survey

On the next page are the 2022 Wine Grape Survey results. All figures are actual values and acreages reported by growers. This survey, which goes out to over 200 growers, is a valuable resource for current and prospective vineyard owners and managers in El Dorado County.

Of special interest from the 2022 survey:

- The total crop value for grapes in El Dorado County was \$4,180,365 for 2022. This value is down 42% from the 2021 value of \$7,207,273.
- Total production in 2022 was down 64% as compared to 2021 (2,326 tons in 2022 vs. 6,432 tons in 2021). This drop in production was primarily attributed to damage from a hard freeze in April 2022.
- Average price per ton increased 28% from the 2021 price of \$1,604 per ton to \$2,050 per ton in 2022.
- Total wine grape tonnage sold outside of El Dorado County decreased by 67% from 2,219 tons in 2021 to 742 tons in 2022.
- Total bearing and non-bearing wine grape acreage for El Dorado County is 2,800 acres.
- The top five varietals most affected by freeze damage were Chardonnay, Pinot Noir, Nebbiolo, Malbec, and Viognier.
