RE: Mosquito Recovery Update

Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fires as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- Anvil commenced operations on Monday, April 17, 2023
 - Asbestos abatement is completed
 - Debris removal has started and is estimated to be complete by April 26, 2023.
- Addendum letters were sent out to the 19 ROE submitters which includes an assignment of all claims against PG&E for costs and damages for debris removal associated with the Mosquito Fire.
 - 19 have been completed and returned to EMD (100%)
 - 1 withdrawal form along with an application for the Alternate Program has been received – Approval is still pending.
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- Tetra Tech Stats (as of 4/20/2023 @ 9:11 AM)
 - Site Assessments Complete: 19 (100%)
 - Asbestos Assessments Complete: 19 (100%)
 - Biological Assessments Complete: 19 (100%)
 - 1 Debris Removal complete (5%)
 - 16 Sites ready for debris removal
- ROE Universe:
 - 19 received and approved:
 - 11 permitted structures
 - 9 unpermitted dwellings/outbuildings
 - 1 ROE was disqualified for not having a qualifying structure
 - 1 parcel is still pending approval to opt into the Alternative Program. EMD has received the withdrawal form and application for the Alternate Program and is being reviewed for approval.
- Vehicles:

- Waiting on CHP to adjudicate the remaining vehicles – tentative scheduled for April 29-30.

• Social Services

- Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP): This program assists people experiencing or at risk of homelessness who are likely eligible for disability benefits by providing advocacy for disability benefits as well as housing supports. The housing supports this program offers includes interim shelter assistance, rental assistance, housing navigation, case management, security deposits, utility payments, moving costs, legal services, and credit repair.

 - This survivor was told about HDAP while at the Upper Room and contacted the Social Worker
 - Pending: 0
 - There are no new applications for the SW to review
 - Not eligible for the program: 0
 - Clients receiving HDAP assistance: 1
 - This client is housed

• Behavioral Health

- Support Groups: 19 groups, 12 attendees
 - On April 18, 2023 3 new children and 2 new adults attended the Paint Night support group.
- Access: This division within Behavioral Health (BH) reviews new applications for eligibility to BH services. The Mental Health Worker receives applications for BH services from survivors and sends these to the Access team to review.
 - Referrals: 1
 - The Mental Health Worker met this survivor while assisting at the Mosquito fire evacuation center
 - Pending: 0
 - There are no new applications for services for the Mental Health Worker to review
 - Not eligible for the BH services: 0
 - Clients Eligible for BH Services: 1
 - BH has found 1 client eligible for BH services
