Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- EMD and Air Quality Management District determined that no damaged or destroyed parcels are in the areas of naturally occurring asbestos of the burn scar.
- Cross referencing lists from multiple departments to develop a list of parcels that need to have debris removed. This list will be used to contact those owners who have not submitted a ROE.
- 12 ROEs have been submitted and accepted.
