Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

### Environmental Management

- Phase 1 – Hazard Household Waste clean-up was completed October 10, 2022. 30 sites were serviced.
- Researching options for debris cleanup via CalOES partners and other Counties that did not receive State or Federal financial assistance.

### Health and Human Services Agency

- **Social Worker**
