Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- EMD is working with the Air Quality Management District to determine if there are any affected parcels in a naturally occurring asbestos zone. If there is, it may require an asbestos mitigation plan to be included in the debris removal project.
- Six (6) ROEs have been received, reviewed, and accepted.

Land Use

- **Social Worker**
 - The Social Worker met with a survivor on November 22 to assist in finding stable housing.
