- **Social Worker**
  - On November 1, 2022, the Social Worker and Mental Health Worker met with two survivors in Volcanoville. The fire burned one survivor's mobile home and the other lost their travel trailer. One of the survivors will be assisting with the distribution of housing and support group information to other survivors in the area and will also be posting our information on local Facebook pages.
  - We had previously asked the local fire chief for any survivor information they may be able to share with us and we are waiting for a response.

  - The Mental Health Worker continues to provide support groups to the survivors
