**RE: Mosquito Fire Recovery update**

Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fire as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

While awaiting notification from the State about California Disaster Assistance Act funding, the ROC is engaging in due diligence with Mariposa County to better understand its approach to debris and hazardous tree cleanup from the Oak Fire for which it did not receive Public Assistance or Individual Assistance and, as a result, is implementing a County-managed program. Additionally, we are continuing to explore options with Placer County for a unified command-type of recovery approach to the Mosquito Fire, as well as exploring all options for cleanup assistance to our survivors.
