RE: Mosquito Fire Recovery update

Please accept this memo as a weekly update to the activities surrounding the County of El Dorado's recovery from the Mosquito Fires as managed by the Recovery Operations Center's (ROC) co-directors Sgt. Moke Auwae and me.

Environmental Management

- **Phase 1 Household Hazardous Waste cleanup**
 - Conducted by the State Department of Toxics Substance Control, it will begin Oct. 6th in El Dorado County.
- **Debris cleanup**
 - In discussions with County Counsel, ROC and the State to determine the best steps forward and what is needed from the Department depending on the program selected.

Land Use

- **Inspection Map**
 - Creating a public-facing map for residents to see the status of their properties.

Health and Human Services Agency

- **Social Worker**
 - The Social Worker has received two Mosquito Fire referrals over the past week. They are reviewing one of the referrals today and will be evaluating the other survivor for the HDAP program tomorrow.
 - Next week, the Social Worker and Library HUBs staff will conduct outreach in North County. Schedules and locations are being determined over the coming few business days and full scope of details will be provided next week.
- **Mental Health Worker**
 - They provided support during the Local Assistance Center (LAC) and spoke with around 40 Mosquito Fire survivors.

El Dorado Community Foundation

- Last Thursday over 380 arrived at the Holiday Market in Cool - \$550 was distributed to each family.
